

DRIVING ETIQUETTE FOR SAFER ROADS



1. Avoid honking merely to vent irritation. The horn must be used only to forewarn other motorists.
2. Be considerate to pedestrians, cyclists and rickshaws; they have a right to designated stretches of the road too.
3. Do not throw trash on the road, keep a bag in the car for trash – we all like clean cities.
4. Do not use your mobile while at the wheel. Block out all potential distractions. If you have to use the mobile, please stop the car to talk.
5. Avoid high beam light; it poses a threat to other motorists and to yourself.
6. Make use of indicators - they warn other motorists of your intentions.
7. Keep safe distance from the vehicle ahead of you.
8. Do not double park - it prevents other cars from getting out of their slots; instead, find a clear slot to park in.
9. Avoid speeding and do not drive while under medication or under the influence of alcohol.
10. Do not wash your car in running streams. Think of the dirty water somebody downstream might have to drink.
11. Follow speed limits while driving through jungles so that you do not risk the lives of animals. Remember that you are in the abode of the animals; respect them.
